

# Call for Expressions of Interest

## 2028 Integrated System Plan (ISP) Consumer Panel

AEMO invites expressions of interest from stakeholders to join the **2028 Integrated System Plan (ISP) Consumer Panel**, in accordance with clause 5.22.7(c) of the National Electricity Rules (NER).

### About the Integrated System Plan

The ISP sets out the least-cost investment pathway for the National Electricity Market (NEM) to meet consumer energy needs and government policies through to 2050. The ISP is published at least every two years. Materials for the 2026 ISP and previous ISPs are available on [AEMO's website](#).

### About the ISP Consumer Panel

The ISP Consumer Panel provides a consumer-focused perspective on the development of the ISP, with regard to the long-term interests of energy consumers.

Under the NER, the Panel must provide two reports assessing the evidence and reasons supporting AEMO's key ISP publications: the Inputs, Assumptions and Scenarios Report and the Draft ISP. The Panel must comprise at least three members.

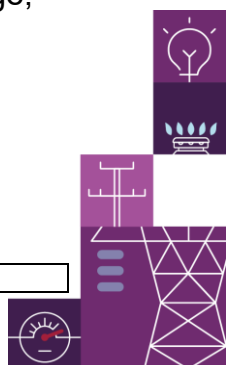
Panel operations, including remuneration, are set out in the accompanying [Terms of Reference](#) (ToR). The AEMC is doing a review of the ISP framework [Review of the Integrated System Plan framework | AEMC](#). The 2028 ISP Consumer Panel ToR may be updated following this review.

In addition to the required reports, the Panel may provide advice on other documents that support the ISP. Based on previous experience, the estimated time commitment for Members during the ISP development process is on average four to eight hours per week, and the contracted time allocated will allow up to 10 hours per week (averaged over the course of the duration of the contract).

### Selection criteria

AEMO is seeking a Panel that collectively represents a range of consumer perspectives. Members will be selected based on demonstrated experience in:

- Australia's energy sector, including transmission, distribution, generation, storage, regulation or consumer energy resources



- Representing the long-term interests of energy consumers, including with respect to the price, reliability, security of supply and safety of electricity supply or emissions reduction
- Constructive participation in collaborative, multi-stakeholder processes, including the timely delivery of high quality written and verbal advice.

### **Submitting an expression of interest**

Expressions of interest close **5:00 pm (AEST), Friday 17 April 2026**, and should be emailed to [ISP@aemo.com.au](mailto:ISP@aemo.com.au).

Applications should include:

- Contact details and business details (if applicable)
- Response to the selection criteria
- Current CV
- Two referees
- Indication of interest in the Chair role (if applicable)
- Any actual, potential or perceived conflicts of interest

Submission of an expression of interest constitutes acceptance of the EOI terms.
